Introduction:

The concept was created when Meg Olsen, Arts Teacher at Mountain View Core Knowledge School, was approached by the Fremont Arts Council about doing a mural project with students. The project had stalled when, in late 2017, the Stormwater Program learned of it. The Stormwater Program felt that it would fit into the City of Cañon City's Stormwater Permit requirements for Public Education and Outreach. The idea would be to involve local students to design and paint murals incorporating environmental awareness and the Cañon City environment.

Many cities and counties are incorporating storm drain art into their public education and outreach programs for stormwater permits. Some cities and counties throughout the nation and Colorado have spent \$10,000 or more to do storm drain art, paying local artists for their designs and time to paint. We felt that the opportunity existed with a public arts mural program to showcase local students' talent, and at the same time afford them the opportunity to learn about the impacts human activity can have on the environment. Several existing murals in public areas of Cañon City are in need of updating or replacement as they are fading, peeling or have been defaced by graffiti. The multi-year mural program will replace these existing murals with new ones and potentially add murals in more public areas. Using this strategy also helps to keep costs down, while providing eye-catching and educational murals for Cañon City residents and visitors to enjoy.

General Overview:

The Public Arts Mural Program is a joint program between Mountain View Core Knowledge School and the Cañon City Stormwater Program. Its purpose is to engage local students and the public in environmental education by creating murals around environmental themes.

The program engages both local students and citizens in the research, design and creation of the murals. The murals incorporate environmental awareness and education along with local attractions such as the Royal Gorge Railroad, the Royal Gorge and whitewater rafting/Arkansas River. The murals also serve the purpose of an appealing format to educate local citizens and visitors of the importance of environmental stewardship and water quality to Cañon City and its environs. The projects also serve to meet some of the City of Cañon City's Stormwater Discharge permit requirements in the area of education and outreach.

A Public Arts Mural Program Committee was formed and planning meetings began early in 2018 to determine potential sites, costs and the general timeline of the program. The committee was comprised of:

The 4th Street Viaduct was chosen as the first site for replacement of existing murals, with the exception of one mural which was in good shape and would be touched up. "Clean Environment: The People and Animals That Depend On It" was chosen as the theme. A call for artwork was distributed throughout the Cañon City School System by contacting local teachers and placing posters in the area schools. Announcements were also made on the City of Cañon City's social media and website, by placing posters in strategic areas throughout the City and through news articles in the Cañon City Daily Record. Art submittals were due by February 1, 2019 and an art show was held at the Fremont Center for the Arts from March 1 – 22, 2019. The public was encouraged to vote on their top three choices, both at the art show and through on-line voting. The top ten artworks were then given to City Council to choose the artwork for the center piece of the mural site. The rest, plus others from the show were arranged into either stand-alone pieces or collages for the remainder of the mural site.

Painting of the murals with volunteers took place from June 3 – 21, with finishing touches completed by about July 19, 2019.

Art Submittals and Art Show

Art submittals were received from Cañon City area Kindergarten to 12th Grade students; most of the submittals came from students at Mountain View Core Knowledge School with some from the Cañon City High School, home-schooled students and the Creative Kids 4H Club. From the 134 art submittals, 66 were chosen to be featured during the art show at the Fremont Center for the Arts. The public was asked to vote on their top three choices by voting at the art show and on-line. The public cast 490 ballots between the two voting avenues, for a total of 1,395 votes. The top ten art submittals were:

- Alexandra Weatherill CCHS 12th Grade (chosen by City Council to be featured on the large support)
- Leilani Medina Home School 6th Grade (2 entries in the top 10)
- Creative Kids 4H Club various grades
- Natalie Henry MVCKS 2nd Grade
- Quinn Witkowski MVCKS 2nd Grade
- Emily Rabinovitz MVCKS 7th Grade
- Gavin Reddick, Thor Shelver, Joel Riva and Mason Coleman joint submittal MVCKS 4th Grade
- James Henry MVCKS 4th Grade
- Taylor Garruto MVCKS 5th Grade

The top ten art works were submitted to City Council for selection of the art work which would be featured on the large support at the mural site. See Appendix A for a complete list of the chosen artists and artwork.

Painting the Murals

A call for volunteers was made through the City of Cañon City social media sites, Cañon City Daily Record and sign-up sheets at area schools and City Hall. Over 70 adults and children volunteered to assist in transferring the murals and painting them, spending over 250 hours on the project. Work began June 3, 2019 and ran for two weeks. Final touches were added at the end of June into July. See Appendix B for a full list of volunteers. A sign acknowledging all the artists whose art work was used, all the volunteers, donors and the Public Arts Mural Project Committee was installed in the way-finding kiosk at the site once all work was completed.

Funding and Expenditures

Initial funding for the project was provided by the City of Cañon City and Mountain View Core Knowledge School; \$1500.00 and \$300.00 respectively. Donations from local businesses and individuals of cash, advertising signage, paint and supplies, and the final sealant totaled just over \$745.00. Donors included:

- 3rd Dimension Signs: Sign mounting and use of equipment for pattern transfers
- BB's: Volunteers Needed sign
- Sam Crawford Family: Paint
- The Dungeon Inc: Cash donation
- Henry's Custom Painting: Sealant top coat for the finished murals
- Home Depot: Paint
- True Value: Paint and Supplies

The program spent \$910.69 on supplies for the art show, mural painting and kiosk acknowledgement sign. See Appendix C for the list of donated items and expenditures. Additionally, the Committee, Parks Department employees and the Cañon City Public Information Officer spent approximately 331 hours on the project.

Summary

Without the generous donations of supplies, cash and man hours by our local businesses and citizens this project would not have been possible to complete with the available funding. Cash funding through the City and Mountain View Core Knowledge School, along with the cash donation from The Dungeon Inc totaled \$1900.00. The value of the supplies donated and the hard costs incurred by the program totaled \$1655.88. If Colorado's current minimum wage of \$11.10 per hour was applied to the volunteer hours spent on the painting the murals alone the cost would have been \$2784.00.

The Public Arts Mural Program has provided an opportunity for local students, businesses and citizens to be involved in an educational outreach project which provides an appealing venue to promote our local environment and attractions to our citizens and visitors to the area. The Program will continue this outreach with our next project at the drainage channel on the west side of Centennial Park.
