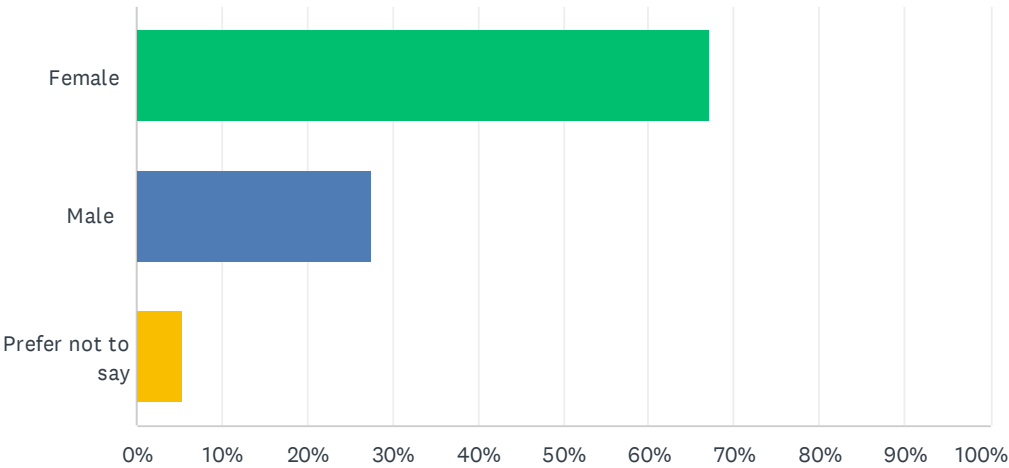

Q6 What is your gender?

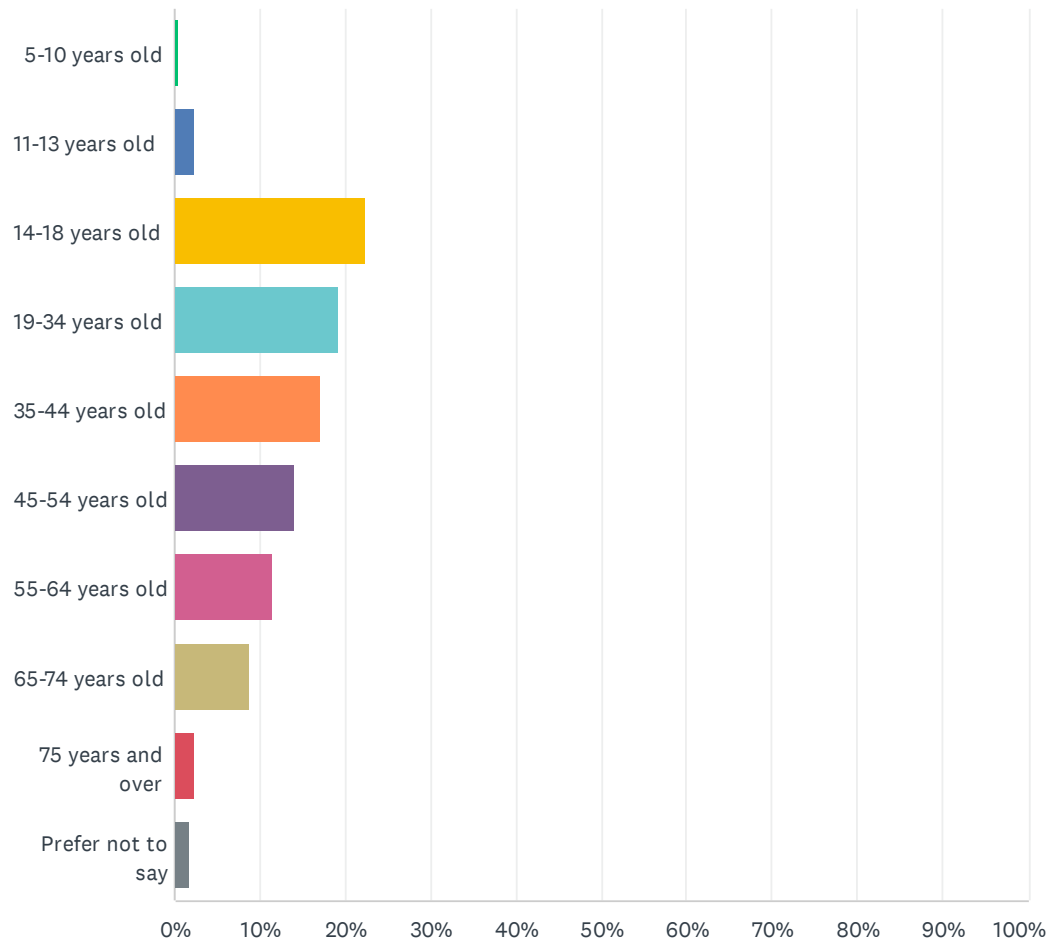

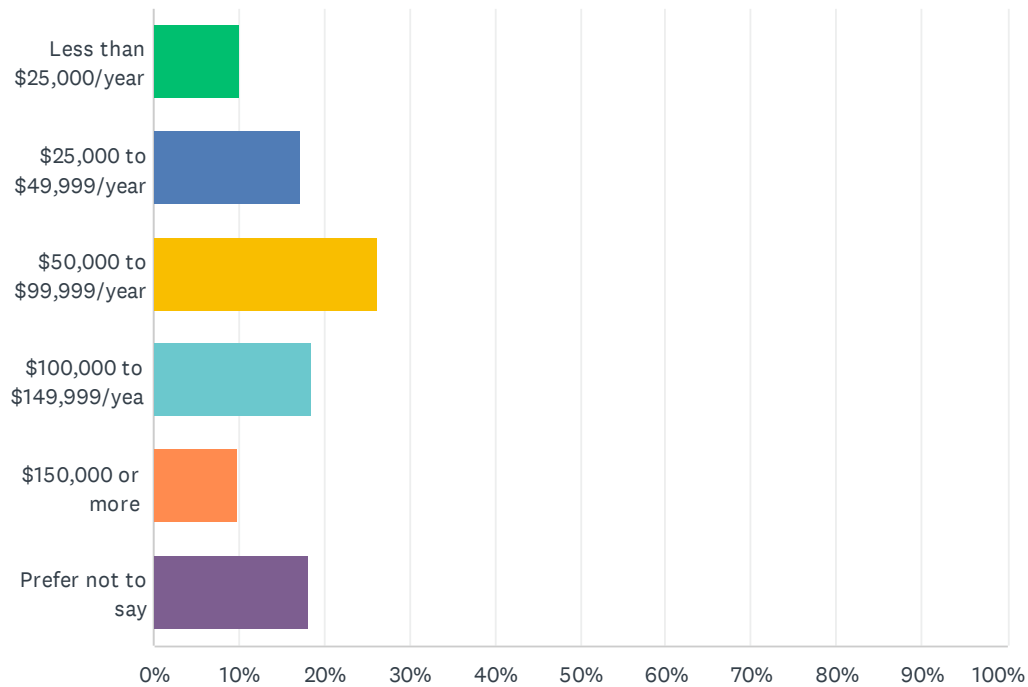

Q8 In what range is your yearly household income?

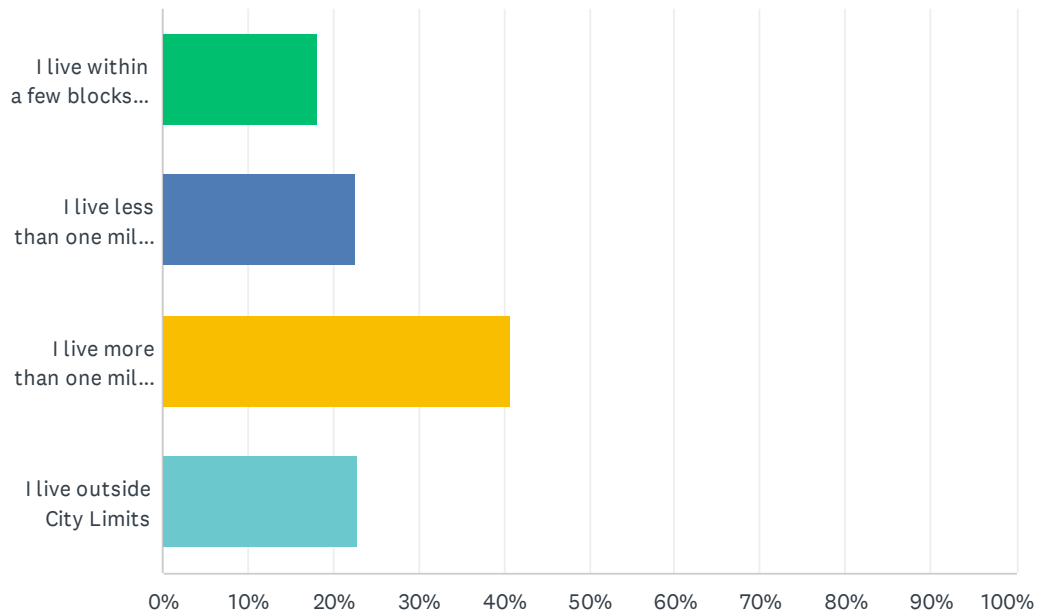

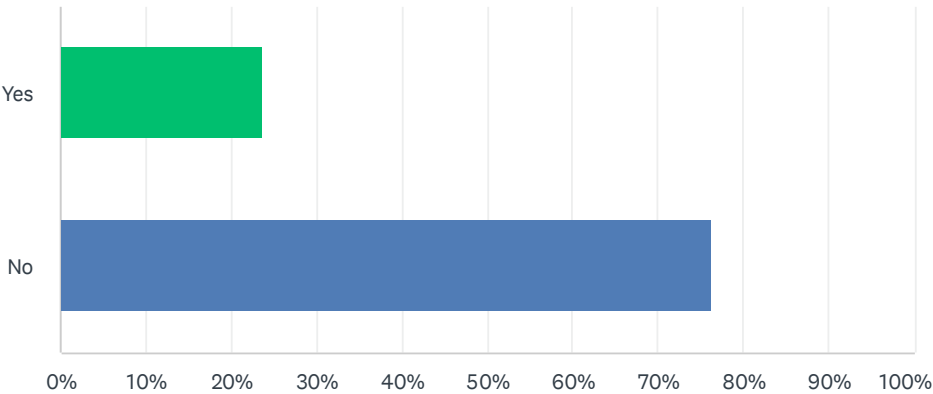
