

Letter from Oramel Lucas to Dr. F.V. Hayden to order books from the USGS. Note in paragraph three the reference to *Amphicoelias fragilimus*, the enormous specimen.

Dr. F.V. Hayden,

Dear Sir,

I have for some time been desirous to obtain some of your reports on the western vertebrate fauna, more particularly the quarto publications and of these I desire most those which contain reports of the fossils which I have been exuming, if such reports have been published in your quarto volumes. If they have not yet been published, may I ask you to retain my name as one to whom it is to be sent when published. I have seen in the American Naturalist a notice of your New Atlas of Colorado and adjacent Territories. If this publication is for free distribution to field workers I desire you to send a copy to my address. If not for free distribution please inform me of the price. I have received from you your very excellent report of the geological survey of 1875. I find that such publications are a help to me and I am desirous of obtaining your next volume of report on the survey of this western country when it is published.

I am now at work on a second Camarasaurus Supremus which is in better preservation than the first and the prospect is that I shall be able to find a larger part of the whole skeleton than the first.

You have doubtless seen Prof. Cope's report on the *Amphicoelias fragilimus*, the vertebra of which is six feet in elevation requiring a femur twelve feet long, almost fabulous dimensions.

I expect to spend the winter at Oberlin Ohio, hence if you can send one of your new atlas of Colorado and the quarto publications that will be of most use to me in field work. Please send to O.W. Lucas, Oberlin, Ohio and greatly ablige.
