Letter from Amasa W. Lucas to Charles Sherburne

Discusses the deaths of fellow soldiers and ask Charles to give his heart to Jesus.

Pittsfield Oct 30th 1864

Dear Friend Charles.

It has been some time since I received your letter of the 18 of Sep and I am ashaimed to think that I have not answered it yet, you inquired about Ira, we have not heard from him for almost two weeks he was then in a Hospital near City point Va and he expected to go to Washington soon, he has been sick about six weeks. he says he dont have to take any medicine he is getting better. he said that he was going to try to get his pay and a furlough and come home and recruit his health. I hope he can for he has not had a cent from government yet. We have had sad times and sad news here in Pitts lately

I have helpt to bear two of your comrads and fellow soldiers to their last resting place the silent tomb James and Wallis were buried only eleven days from each other James was buried wenesday and his father the next tuesday and Wallis the next sunday. the next news that Carlos is a prisoner in the hands of the rebels and that Erwin is sick in the hospitall this is sad news indead. you said if I was going to enlist not to do so for him. I can assure you that when I enlist it will not be for fun or for money but becaus it is my duty to go for I know there is no fun about it. I am not going to school this fall but I expect to go to school this winter here at home. Miss Samson is going to teach our school this winter. I do hope this war will

soon be over when the soldiers may return home, but I dont want it closed untill the south is conquered and this great rebellion is put down. I went out to the lake twise this fall. there has not been any thing of importance going on here this fall. The Dr and his wife have got home he looks well and healthy Arthur told me that you had goen back to the Regiment so I will direct this time to the regt. when you get this I hope you will write sooner thin I have done. I have had a great deal to do this fall and dont get much time for writeing or running about but have had to stick to the work like a good fellow, but still I am ashaimed to think that I have not answered it untill now. I hope you will pardon

me this time and I will try and do better next time.

Charles does it not make you feel sad when you see many of your comrads falling ~~by~~ in battle and by disease all around you, and does it not make you feel the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death. and can you pass through all of these cenes without the help of the Savior. Oh Charles, do I beg of you give your heart to Jesus and put your trust in him and he will help you in the hour of battle and in the hour of temptation he will give you power to overcome temptation and he is the friend you need to fit you for your great and last change and also to meet our maker in the Judgement. now Charles will you not promise me that you will give your hart to Jesus and serve him. there may be those about you who will laugh at you but never mind they will not laugh when we meet in the last great judgement day. this from your affectionate and true friend
